The college has 14 spacious and well-equipped laboratories, Central Instrumentation Facility, seminar hall (with internet connectivity, a projector, and an audio-video system), Cultural Activities Facility, Gymnasiums (916-square-meter sports campus for indoor and outdoor games with body fitness equipment), Playground (400 m track, courts for handball, football, volley ball, kabaddi and Kho-Kho courts), Administrative office, The principal's office, The Central Library / Knowledge Resource Centre (total floor size of 561.68 square meters), APJ Abdul Kalam Vacchan Katta, Career Guidance and Placement Cell, Student Consumer Store, For the boys and girls separate facilities like parking areas, common room, toilet blocks and hostels (each of capacity of 40 students with a purified drinking water solar power &solar water heaters), Botanical gardens, ICT Facility (139 computers, 17 LCD projectors, 45 printers & UPS facility for backup), E-Content Development Studio, Nikon camera, webcams and headphone sets, 03 photocopiers. The campus is protected by wall fencing and CCTV surveillance. Ramps are constructed wherever required.
